Osteopathic Physicians Fact Sheet and Frequently Asked Questions

FACT SHEET

The New Mexico Medical Board has merged with the Osteopathic Physicians effective as of July 1, 2021. Effective as of now, any Osteopathic Physician is to apply to the New Mexico Medical Board.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. Are and fees, including licensure fees, changing?

Yes, some fees are changing. All fees are coinciding with the current fees that the NM Medical Board charges for the Medical Doctor profession. For the most part most fees are remaining the same. Telemedicine application fee will now be \$400, and tri-annual Telemedicine renewal will also be \$400. Verifications of Licensure will be \$37.

2. Does a Criminal History Background Check need to be completed to issue an Osteopathic Physician license?

Yes, the requirement by the Board is that a completed Criminal Background check is needed to issue any License.

3. As an applicant, where do I mail my documentation for my license application?

You can mail your documentation into the Board office at NMMB, 2055 South Pacheco Street, Bldg. 400, Santa Fe, NM 87505. You can also fax in to (505) 476-7233. You also can have documentation emailed in to the main board email at nmbme@state.nm.us.

4. How do I update my address?

You can mail, email or fax in your updated address to the Board Office. The Board requires both a personal address and a business address for your file. The personal address remains confidential. The business address is used for the
